- Girls aged 13 to 15 are the most at risk...
- Boys are however not excluded...
- Stranger Danger...
- Grooming/Seduction...
- Compliant adolescent female with older male...



Luring & Traveling Sex Offenders

- At any given time there are approximately 50,000 predators on line trolling for children



Luring – Canadian Children at Risk 2005 Media Awareness Survey

94% have the internet at home...

37% have personal computer & Internet ...

86% have email access (EG: Hotmail)...

22% have personal webcam...

25% are asked to meet someone they met on the internet...

21% have met with the person...

12% person wanted or made sexual contact; used vulgar sexual language..
