## The CACP membership adopts four new resolutions

**OTTAWA, ONTARIO** – During the Annual General Meeting held on August 24<sup>th</sup>, the membership of the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police (CACP) accepted [four \(4\) new resolutions](#) proposed by CACP general committees.

Resolutions generally consist of a request to a government ministry to create or amend legislation, an outline of a position of the association, a statement or belief of the association, a course of action, a formal statement of a decision or expression of opinion, and/or a formal expression of intention.

The following resolutions were approved by the membership:

- 2020-01 – Supporting Victims of Terrorism, Mass Violence and Mass Casualty
- 2020-02 – Supporting the Creation of a National Public Safety Broadband Network
- 2020-03 – Identifying the Missing Children Society of Canada's *Child Search Network* as a key component of the national strategy for missing children
- 2020-04 – The urgent replacement of the Automated Criminal Intelligence Information System (ACIIS)
